1. Request for use of the Town Park and the Senior Center

Supervisor DePasquale reported that a request come in from Rachel Potter for the use of the Town Park and the concession stand and refrigerator. The recreation department does store items in the fridge along with supplies in the concession stand with that said Supervisor DePasquale was wondering how the Town Board felt about having someone use the fridge and the concession stand. After some discussion the Town Board agreed to let Racheal Potter reserve the shelter and have the bathrooms available but deny the use of the concession stand and refrigerator.

Supervisor DePasquale stated that Michael Sullivan and Rick Tornow from Boy Scout Troup 583 would like to address the Town Board on having a key for the Senior Center. The Senior Center doors were rekeyed there have been many incidents over the last year or so with doors being left open and with so many people having keys and also some damage from birds being inside the building. With all the door locks being changed over and limiting the number of keys issued the Town Board will be able to have a little more control over who is using the Senior Center. Michael and Rick stated that the Boy Scouts have had a key to the building in the past for when there meetings are held and to store their camping gear and would like to obtain a new key for the use of the building when needed. They stated the inconvenience for a person to come in and sign a key out with their work schedules and the Town Clerk office hours. There was discussion about letting the Boy Scouts have another key for the Senior Center and a checklist for them to use after each meeting. The Town Board decided to let the Boy Scouts have a key which was issued to Rick Tornow.

2. Out Door movie projector for Colden Recreation

Supervisor DePasquale stated that a donation was received last year from a past resident who donated \$500.00 to the recreation department in memory of Keven Rothenberg who passed away

a few years ago. The plan for the money is to buy a projector and inflatable screen to show movies outside at Kummer Park. After checking with the Town of Alexander their projector was in the \$2,000 to \$3,000 range. Supervisor DePasquale was going to check with the Town of Aurora on their equipment and Councilman Hrycik will see how Erie County equipment is used at Chestnut Ridge Park.

3. Surplus items for Hazman event on 9/15/18

Supervisor DePasquale stated that the following items will be surpluses 1 Dell computer, 2 Gateways computers, 1 Large gigabyte computer, 2 monitors, 2 Sonyo TV,s from the Sheriff's department and 2 remote controls at the HAZMAN event this Saturday, September 15th.
