# 1. Update GPS on Town Vehicles

Supervisor DePasquale stated that the current GPS from Network Fleet Verizon is being phased out. There is a program through OGS contract called Reveal, there is no charge to install, and the monthly cost is \$18.95. The program has more features with tracking and updates. The Town Board is not monitoring the town vehicles 24/7 the purpose for the GPS system is for security and safety. The Town Board has received calls on whether the trucks are out plowing in the winter or maybe they have seen a truck somewhere. The GPS can show times and places the vehicles have been out at and were in town. The Pros would come out and install the systems in the vehicles, they would also come out add or remove a system. Under no circumstances is the highway department to remove or disconnect any of the systems in the vehicles. Town Board will bring this up for a vote at the regular Town Board meeting tonight.

### 2. Discussion Disk Golf

Supervisor DePasquale introduced Scott Kirby, Scott came to the Town Board back in December 2021 and presented a Disc Golf Course plan for Kummer Park. The plan was for 18 baskets and a course was drawn out and a breakdown was submitted on an approximate cost of the course, the course would be a great addition to the park for residents and clubs in the area. The Town Board reviewed the plan again at tonight's workshop along with discussing staffing for maintenance on the course when complete. The course would probably not be complete until 2023 because of supplies being hard to come by. There was discussion on adding a part-time employee to maintain the course as well for next year. Scott would layout the plan and have help from the highway and parks department as well as volunteers from various disc golf clubs in the area. Along with the course there is also an Eagle Scout who is planning a project building hiking paths and benches in the park that would blend well with Disc Golf Course. The cost of the project would be allowed through ARPA funding if the Town Board decides to move forward with the project.

## 3. Review Allocations of Cares Act

Supervisor DePasquale touched on the following items that the town would be using ARPA funding. The following will be in the report due April 30<sup>th</sup>.

A second round of funding will be coming in June \$173,000.00, and projects that are being looked at are infrastructure to sidewalks throughout the town, including the sidewalk at the west end by the Colden Elementary to existing bridge. Another project being looked at is converting the Historical lights to LED.
